The evening then began with an intense moment highlighted by the extraordinary performance of Salim Ejnaini, supported by his godfather Guillaume Canet and the President of EEM and founder of the Longines Masters, Christophe Ameetuw. This rider who has competed Thursday and Friday on Invitational events is the first blind to participate in the Longines Masters of Paris. Salim Ejnaini and his coach Tiffany Margueritat adapted a method without horse guide which consists of being oriented solely by voice indications, thanks to criers placed on the track and the complicity of his horse Rapsody. Tonight, with the participation of criers - composed of young from his equestrian center but also riders Guillaume Canet, Thierry Rozier and Philippe Rozier, Olympic medalist in Rio - Salim demonstrated to the public tonight by officiating on the same track That the riders of the Gold Cup with bars at 1 m, that he is resolutely like the others! Before the peak of the evening, the youngest riders and Shetland ponies of Haras de Hardy succeeded in raising the temperature on the track during a frenzied race.
